

In March of 2023 the Fair completed the purchase of the Perdue Acoustics site, aided by a \$100K appropriation secured by Jay Reedy with the Perdue family carrving a \$300K 6-vear note for the balance. To follow through with the purchase, the Fair is kicking off its "Fairwell to the mortgage" campaign, with the goal being to raise \$50K / year to pay off the mortgage. In support of this the fair has applied for a 501c3 nonprofit status from the IRS.

With ownership of the site secured, the door is opened for multiple opportunities for grants from both public and private sources to improve the fairgrounds, including construction, equipment and landscaping. Be on the lookout for coming improvements!

General Rules and Regulations



Entry Dates is Tuesday, September 12, 2023 3:00PM-7:00PM and Wednesday, September 13, 2023 10:00AM - 2:00PM for all exhibits.

All exhibitors are advised to carefully read the rules and regulations set forth below. Exhibitors should also read the special rules which govern the departments in which they expect to exhibit.

The Houston County Fair, Inc. reserves the right to change any and all rules, carry over the program from day to day and declare off any classes or premiums because of the acts of God, or causes not within the management's control. Every possible precaution will be taken to safeguard the articles and animals exhibited on the grounds, but the Houston County Fair Inc. will not be held responsible, in any case, for the loss or damage to articles or animals.

Although every effort will be made to eliminate any problem or misunderstanding, the Houston County Fair Inc. reserves the right to change, delete or add any Lot, Class or Rule as needed. Participants will be informed of any changes at the time of entry and same will be posted on the Houston County Fair website: www.houstoncofair.com

Competitions are open to both residents and non-residents of Houston County.

Except relics and curios, all articles entered for exhibit must have been raised, crafted or produced by the exhibitor; otherwise no premium will be paid on such exhibit.

Every entry must be exhibited in the name of the actual owner or producer. <u>Only one entry per person per lot allowed.</u>

Address labels are requested with entries to ensure accuracy and to ease the entry process.

Canning entries that are not sealed will be removed and discarded.

Cooking entries should be brought on paper plates and in zip lock bags, please no Cling Wrap or Aluminum Foil.

Frames of honey should be in sanitary, bee-proof container. All honey and beewax must be produced by exhibitor.

On the entry of each animal or article, a tag will be furnished, specifying the class, the number of the lot, and the number of the entry, which card must remain attached in a conspicuous place near the animal or article during the exhibition. The companion card will be given to the Exhibitor and needed for pickup verification. Purebred animals will be identified by tattoo.

Please bring the specified quantity required by lot or class, only. Except for sewing, quilts and handwork, all entries must have been completed within the past year, unless otherwise stated.

General Rules and Regulations continued



Entries should NOT have the exhibitor's name on them except as otherwise noted.

All livestock must pass appropriate health inspection by the State Department of Agriculture.

Plants and Flowers must be free from all disease and insects.

Exhibits entered for competition will be under the control of the chairperson for that department.

Premiums will be awarded only for the lots listed in the catalog. Where there is no competition in the lot, the judge will determine if the entry will receive first, second or third place. The entry may not be placed if the judge so determines.

Judges' decisions are final.

Premiums and prizes are paid only from awards made by the judges as they appear on the signed judges' sheets and cards of records and not from ribbons attached to the exhibit. Premiums will be paid out when exhibits are picked up <u>September 17th, 1:00PM—4:00PM</u> Exhibitors will not be allowed to remove an entry before the designated time. Early removal will forfeit all premiums and ribbons and the exhibitor will not be allowed to enter in the future exhibits.

Premium Checks not cashed within sixty (60) days of check date will become void and will not be honored. All checks will be made in the name of the bona fide owner or grower.

No person will be allowed in the Exhibit building when entries are received or judged, with the exception of persons directly involved with the designated event.

Entries will be removed <u>NO EARLIER</u> than the *Sunday*, *September 17, 2023* following the Fair's end. 1:00 p.m.- 4:00 p.m.. Premiums will be paid at this time.

At the conclusion of the Fair, the exhibitor must claim and take entire charge of his exhibit and supervise the removal, but no exhibit shall be removed or disarranged prior to the time designated in each department.

The Houston County Fair Inc. will not be responsible for any articles left in the Exhibit Building after the designated time of removal. All perishables will be removed and discarded. Other articles left more than fourteen (14) days after the designated removal date, will become property of the Houston County Fair, Inc.

The Houston County Fair Inc is not be responsible for any loss, damage or accident that may occur to any person or entry. The Houston County Fair Inc. will take every reasonable precaution to safeguard all persons visiting and/or working at the Fair. The Exhibit Building will be locked after hours.

Please DO NOT enter items that are of sentimental value or that you can not live without. There is always the remote chance that something can be broken or turn up missing.



TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF CONSUMER & INDUSTRY SERVICES ANIMAL HEALTH

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

- I. GENERAL:
 - A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition
 - B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for
 - this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only outof state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
 - C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

- A. SWINE: All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.
- B. CATTLE: All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.
- C. POULTRY:
 - (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
 - (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.
- D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE: Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.
- E. SHEEP
 - (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method ap proved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- F. GOATS
 - (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certify cate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibit ion and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2 -3-.01 (1).
- H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provide ed in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

- III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:
 - A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry): Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.
 - B. CATTLE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:
 - Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
 - (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)
 - C. SWINE: No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies. D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES: Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.
 - E. POULTRY: Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative PullorumTyphoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.
 - F. SHEEP
 - (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, exposit ions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - G. GOATS
 - (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certify cate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establish ment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Feder al Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibit tion and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method ap proved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
 - H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle. I. CERVIDAE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:
 - (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
 - (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All Cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry. NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).
- IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

All intact goats and wethers over 18 months of age must have a federally approved scrapie tag permanently attached in its ear or other approved identification. Exhibitors must contact the USDA Vet's office at 615-781-5310 to order their tags. Animals without proper scrapie identification will not be allowed to exhibit.

ALL ANIMALS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE CURRENT CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION. ANIMALS WITHOUT CURRENT HEALTH PAPERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE.




